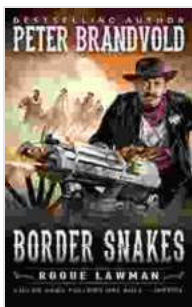


Border Snakes: Classic Western Rogue Lawman

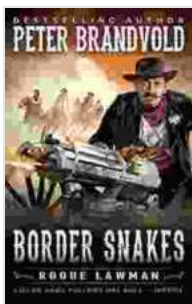

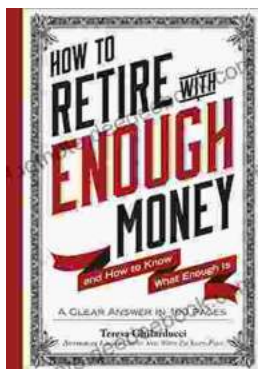
