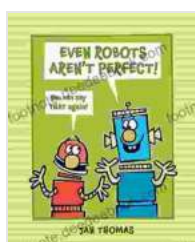


Even Robots Aren't Perfect: The Robots Books

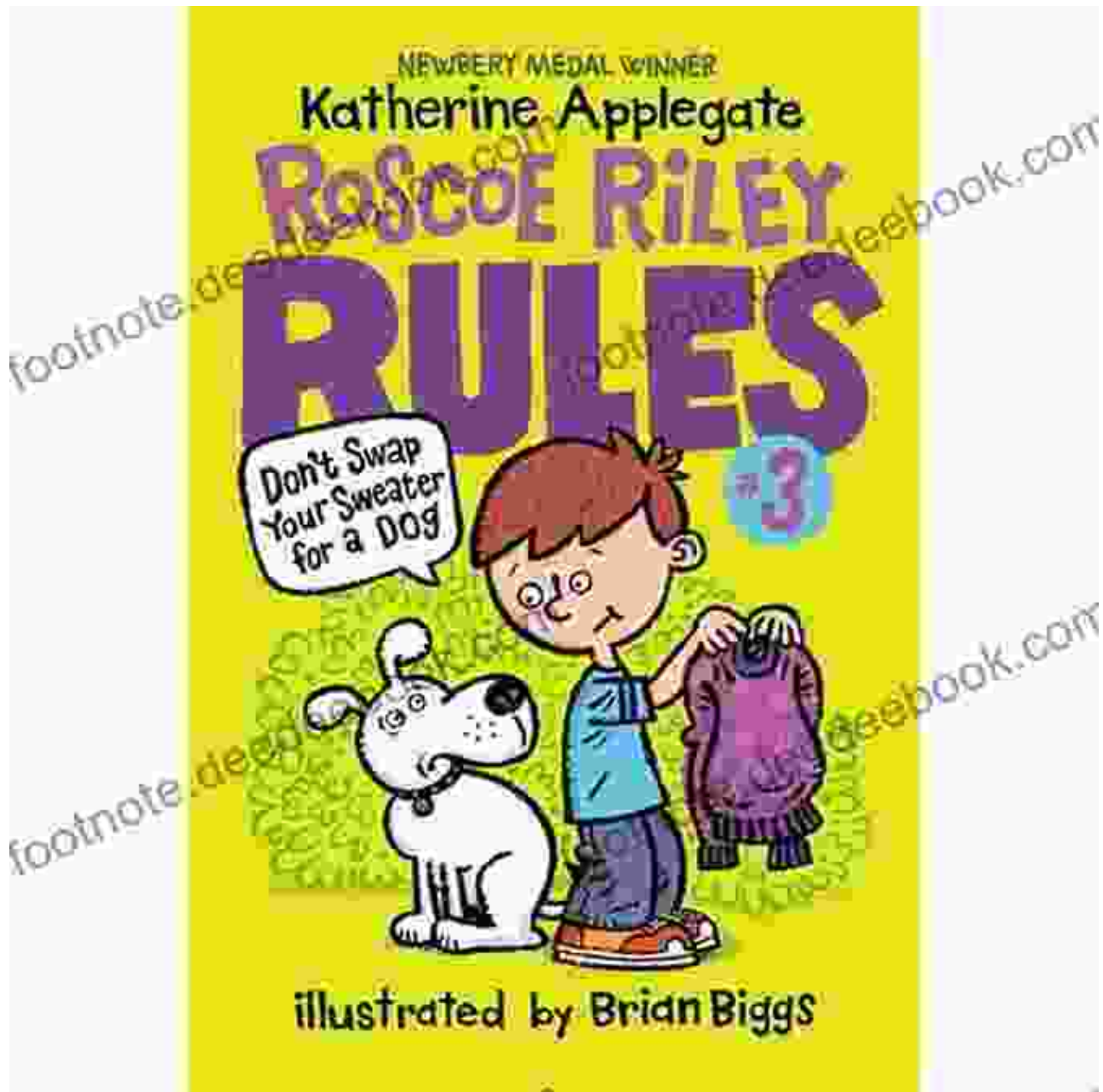

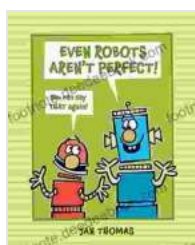

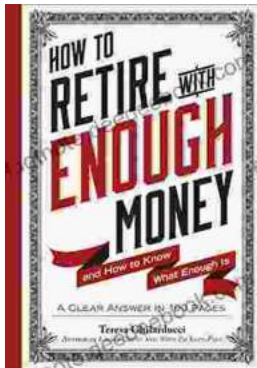
