

Early Life and Education

John William McCormack was born in Boston, Massachusetts, on December 21, 1891. He was the son of Irish immigrants Patrick and Mary McCormack. His father was a shoemaker and his mother was a homemaker. McCormack attended public schools in Boston and graduated from Boston College in 1913. 
Speaker of the House

In 1973, McCormack voted in favor of the first article of impeachment against Nixon, which charged Nixon with obstruction of justice. Nixon resigned from office before the second article of impeachment could be brought to a vote.

Later Life and Legacy

McCormack retired from Congress in 1971. He died in Boston on November 22, 1980. McCormack is remembered as a skilled politician who played a key role in the passage of landmark legislation during the civil rights era.

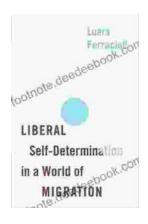
