Materials:

Instructions:

Head:

1. Using brown yarn, make a magic ring.
2. Round 1: 6 single crochet (sc) in the ring, slip stitch (sl st) to join.
3. Round 2: Increase each stitch (2 sc in each sc) around, sl st to join (12 sc).
4. Round 3: (sc, 2 sc in the next sc) around, sl st to join (18 sc).
5. Round 4-6: Sc in each stitch around, sl st to join (18 sc).
6. Round 7: (Sc in the next 2 sc, 2 sc in the next sc) around, sl st to join (24 sc).
7. Round 8-10: Sc in each stitch around, sl st to join (24 sc).
8. Round 11: (Sc in the next 3 sc, 2 sc in the next sc) around, sl st to join (30 sc).
9. Round 12-15: Sc in each stitch around, sl st to join (30 sc).
10. Round 16: Decrease each stitch (sc together) around, sl st to join (15 sc).

11. Round 17: Sc in each stitch around, sl st to join (15 sc).
12. Round 18: Decrease each stitch (sc together) around, sl st to join (8 sc).
13. Cut the yarn, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Ears (make 2):

1. Using brown yarn, make a magic ring.
2. Round 1: 4 sc in the ring, sl st to join.
3. Round 2: Increase each stitch (2 sc in each sc) around, sl st to join (8 sc).
4. Round 3-4: Sc in each stitch around, sl st to join (8 sc).
5. Cut the yarn, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Body:

1. Using brown yarn, chain 25.
2. Row 1: Sc in the second chain from the hook and in each chain across, turn (24 sc).
3. Row 2-5: Sc in each stitch across, turn (24 sc).
4. Row 6: (Sc in the next 6 sc, 2 sc in the next sc) across, turn (27 sc).
5. Row 7-10: Sc in each stitch across, turn (27 sc).
6. Row 11: (Sc in the next 7 sc, 2 sc in the next sc) across, turn (30 sc).
7. Row 12-14: Sc in each stitch across, turn (30 sc).
8. Row 15: (Sc in the next 9 sc, 2 sc in the next sc) across, turn (33 sc).

9. Row 16-18: Sc in each stitch across, turn (33 sc).
10. Row 19: (Sc in the next 11 sc, 2 sc in the next sc) across, turn (36 sc).
11. Row 20-21: Sc in each stitch across, turn (36 sc).
12. Row 22: Decrease each stitch (sc together) across, sl st to join (18 sc).
13. Cut the yarn,



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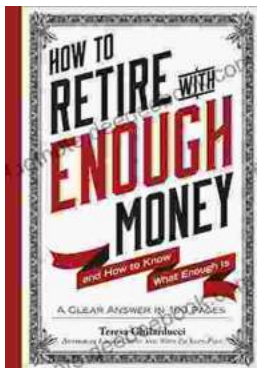
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
